

Climate Change: An Opportunity for Transformation in Africa

SELL Nigeria and SELL Ghana have very important topics to share as Learnings for Life. One of the most important is the issue of Climate Change. According to the Africa Progress report 2015, no region has done less to contribute to the

climate crisis, but no region will pay a higher price for failure to tackle it. Africa is experiencing earlier, more severe and more damaging impacts of climate change than other parts of the world. In each of these areas the poor will bear the brunt. Left unchecked, it will reduce agricultural productivity, create conditions for mass hunger and reverse human development. All countries stand to lose if we fail to achieve the international goal of restricting global warming to

below 2 °C above pre-industrial levels. Africa will lose the most. Africa needs a low-carbon future. It needs to break the link between energy and emissions. This is a Learning for life.

SELL Nigeria

Air pollution is causing health problems. An estimated 600,000 Africans die each year as a result of household air polluted by cooking inside houses, half of them children under the age of five. Almost four in five rely for cooking on solid

biomass, mainly firewood and charcoal. There is need for clean cooking stoves. This is a challenge to SELL to train our young people about the importance of clean cooking and protect themselves from emissions. Achieving access to clean cooking stoves, allied to wider measures, could save thousands of young lives a year, liberate women and girls from the drudgery of collecting firewood generate wide ranging and environmental benefitsSELL continues to be an agent for

change in promoting alternative energy and sharing the learnings of the best and most effective ways of protecting our environment and our health.

In its Annual General Reflection, which took place in April 2017, SELL Foundation Nigeria recorded many success stories from SELL volunteers and beneficiaries across the North east of the country and Plateau. In keeping with its objective of respecting the dignity of youth and providing a space for young people to take ownership of their development in the face of multidimensional strife, ranging from social exclusion to dysfunctional systems, the Foundation has taken on some new initiatives. These included training workshops and seminars on entrepreneurship, skills acquisition, lobby and advocacy as well as the effects of drug abuse among young people. The response from the young people has been very positive and the Co-ordinating Team are happy to be able to supplement the fundamental SELL workshop programme with activities that will help young people release some more of the latent potential that lies within them and enable them to be not just participants in civil society but to take on the mantle of leaders and be agents of change.
